

MANURE MANAGEMENT PLAN

All farming operations GENERATING, APPLYING, OR IMPORTING manure must now have a written Manure Management Plan.

In addition, farming operations that have ANIMAL CONCENTRATION AREAS (ACAs) OR PASTURES must also have a Manure Management Plan .



Manure Management Plans can be prepared by the farmer or an individual experienced in nutrient management. Plans do not have to be submitted for approval but must be kept on the farm and made available upon request.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

If you can say yes to any of the following, you should attend these informative, free sessions

- Generate manure from any number of livestock (dairy, beef, horse, hog, sheep, goat, or poultry)
- Land apply manure (mechanically or by grazing)
- Import or export manure
- Utilize pasture or grazing lands
- Have Animal Concentration Areas (ACAs) (feed lots, loafing areas, exercise lots)
- Agriculturally process wastewater

WHAT SHOULD I BRING?

Participants will have the opportunity to developing their own MMP. Bringing the following will make the development of your own plan possible:

- Conservation plans
- Soil maps
- Any other operational maps
- Farm acreage
- Livestock type and number
- Current soil test
- Current manure test
- Crop information or rotation
- Manure information or records

Soil and manure test are available at the Penn State Extension office.
